

**GARDENDALE, ALABAMA  
CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
OCTOBER 4, 2010**

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The City Council of the City of Gardendale, Alabama, met in a regular meeting on the 4th day of October, 2010, at 6:00 p.m., at the Gardendale City Hall. Mayor Othell Phillips called the meeting to order. City Clerk Keith Mosley led the Pledge of Allegiance. Rudy Guess from the Gardendale-Mount Vernon United Methodist Church delivered the devotional and led the prayer.

City Clerk Keith Mosley was present and served as clerk.

MINUTES

The council was presented with a copy of the minutes of the regular council meeting held on September 20, 2010. Councilor Harper made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Councilor Tumlin and carried by unanimous consent of the council members.

VISITORS

Eddie Vines, candidate for Jefferson County district judge in the Bessemer division, spoke about his experience and qualifications for the office he is seeking and requested support for his candidacy.

BILLS

Councilor Currington made a motion to approve payment of the October 4 bill list, as listed on "Exhibit A," which is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes. The motion was seconded by Councilor Morris and carried by unanimous consent of the council members.

DEPARTMENT HEADS' REPORTS

Police Lieutenant Marty Brown, attending for Police Chief Mike Walker who was not present - No report.

Library director Connie Smith - No report.

Civic Center director John Brigham reported that the annual Gardendale Elementary School carnival was held at the Civic Center on Friday, October 1, and a large crowd attended. He then called on Arts Council member Hazel Butts who announced that the Arts Council will present a dinner theater production of "Nonsense" at the Civic Center on October 21 and 22.

Parks & Recreation superintendent Stan Hogeland reported that the 3rd annual community homecoming bonfire will be held on October 5 at Moncrief Park.

Fire Chief Clint Doss - No report.

Inspection Services superintendent Robert Ryant - No report.

Public Works director Jeff Holliyan reported the following: (a) The Public Works department's fall cleanup will be next week, October 11-15. (b) Leaf vacuum service will begin on November 1 and continue through January 31.

City Clerk Keith Mosley reported that the "Gardendale Cares Enough To Wear Pink" T-shirts can be purchased at the fire station, library, Civic Center, and City Hall as a fundraiser for breast cancer research and awareness.

OLD BUSINESS

RE-CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATION FROM WALGREEN CO. FOR APPROVAL OF A NEW "RETAIL BEER: OFF-PREMISES ONLY" ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE AND A NEW "RETAIL TABLE WINE: OFF-PREMISES ONLY" ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE. Mayor Phillips stated that this application was previously declined by the council because the City's alcoholic beverage ordinance requires that businesses licensed to sell alcohol must be at least 500 feet away from any church or school, and Walgreens is located within 500 feet of the Gardendale First Baptist Church Multi-Purpose Building. However, he said, church officials recently informed him that the Multi-Purpose Building is no longer being used for worship activities and is instead being used only for storage, and Walgreens has requested reconsideration of the application on this basis. He said the Police, Inspections, and Administrative departments have reviewed the application and do not have any objections to its approval. He asked if the representative from Walgreens who was present had any questions; she did not. There was no more discussion. There was not a stated motion for approval of the application, but when Mayor Phillips called for a vote on the application, it was approved by a 4-1 vote of the council members, with Councilors Tumlin, Morris, Currington, and Harper voting aye and Councilor Phillips voting no.

NEW BUSINESS

PRESENTATION OF PLAQUE TO FORMER ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COORDINATOR ROBERT CLOUD. Mayor Phillips stated that Robert Cloud recently decided to step down as the City's economic development coordinator, a position he has held for the past four years on a voluntary basis. He presented a plaque to Mr. Cloud in appreciation of his service.

PROCLAMATION OF THE MONTH OF OCTOBER AS "DYSLEXIA AWARENESS MONTH" IN THE CITY OF GARDENDALE. Mayor Phillips read aloud a proclamation declaring the month of October as "Dyslexia Awareness Month" in the City of Gardendale.

**VIOLATIONS OF THE WEED CONTROL ORDINANCE.** The following properties were cited for being in violation of the City's Weed Control Ordinance:

Mayor Phillips stated that both of those properties have been mowed. No action was taken.

**BID OPENING: RESURFACING THE CITY'S TENNIS COURTS.** Mayor Phillips asked if anyone was present in the audience who had not turned in a sealed bid for this bid opening; there was no reply. He then explained that the City spent about \$250,000 a few years ago to renovate the City's tennis courts, and due to wear and tear it is necessary to re-surface the courts in order to protect that investment. He then opened the sealed bids that were submitted, as authorized by the council during the previous council meeting. The bids were as follows: (a) Lower Bros. Co., Inc. - \$23,400.00; (b) Pro Court Construction - \$27,700.00; (c) Competition Athletic Construction - \$26,550.00 with a possible deduct of \$8,000. Mayor Phillips said the bids would be reviewed by Parks & Recreation director Stan Hogeland.

**AUTHORIZATION TO SOLICIT BIDS FOR FACILITIES AT THE MIRACLE LEAGUE FIELD, PURSUANT TO A H.U.D.-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE GRANT.** Councilor Currington made a motion to solicit bids for purchasing facilities at the Miracle League field, pursuant to a HUD-Economic Development Initiative grant that was recently awarded to the City. Councilor Phillips seconded the motion to solicit said bids. There was no discussion. The motion carried by unanimous consent of the councilors. After the vote was taken, Parks & Recreation director Stan Hogeland asked if bids for some of the individual items to be bid could be received in time to be opened during the next council meeting on October 18. Mayor Phillips answered yes and said the bid submission deadline needs to be included in the bid specifications.

#### ORDINANCES

**PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 2010-13: TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 81-17; TO INCREASE THE RATE OF GENERAL SALES & USE TAXATION FROM THREE PERCENT TO FOUR PERCENT EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2011, THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2014, AND TO DECREASE SAID SALES & USE TAXES FROM FOUR PERCENT TO THREE PERCENT EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2015, AND THEREAFTER.** Councilor Currington read aloud the portions of proposed Ordinance No. 2010-13 that would amend the City's existing sales and use tax regulations. He then made a motion for adoption of the ordinance. The motion was seconded by Councilor Harper. Councilor Currington then made a subsidiary motion for an amendment to the ordinance to revise the effective dates of the proposed new tax rate from the originally proposed dates of November 1, 2010 - October 31, 2014, to January 1, 2011 - December 31, 2014. He said a change in the starting date is necessary because the earliest that RDS, the firm that collects the City's sales tax, would be able to implement the new tax rate would be December 1. After some internal discussions, he said a proposal has been made to postpone the effective date of the ordinance one additional month to the beginning of 2011. Councilor Phillips asked for clarification of the effective date. Councilor Currington said the new tax rate would become effective on January 1, 2011, if the council votes to change the effective date from October 1, 2011, to January 1, 2011, and if the ordinance itself passes.

Mayor Phillips then called the roll of the council members for the purpose of obtaining unanimous consent to suspend the rules in order to vote on the subsidiary motion to change the effective dates of the ordinance from November 1, 2010 - October 31, 2014 to January 1, 2011 - December 31, 2014. The subsidiary motion to amend the effective date of the ordinance from November 1, 2010, to January 1, 2011, was then adopted by unanimous consent of the council members.

Mayor Phillips asked if there was any discussion on the ordinance.

Councilor Phillips said he has received many phone calls and e-mails from people about the tax increase, and none of the people he has heard from are in favor of the tax increase. He said he did want to clarify, however, that the council is in favor of the proposed library renovations whether the tax increase passes or not because, otherwise, the City would lose the use of a \$300,000 grant that has been awarded to the City for the library. On another point, he said he appreciates the work that the Finance Committee has done to come up with the proposed tax increase, but he said he opposes the increase because it's not the right time and because the City has reserves available.

Mayor Phillips said he was also opposed to the tax increase, especially during the current economic climate and also because the City isn't in a dire financial condition.

Mayor Phillips stated that anyone in the audience who wished to speak about the proposed ordinance would be given that opportunity. He asked for everyone in the audience who was opposed to the tax increase to raise their hands and then asked for everyone who supported the tax increase to raise their hands. He then asked if anyone in the audience wished to speak.

Michael Martin, 799 Cluster Springs Road, asked if it would be possible to place the proposed tax increase on the ballot for the elections that will be held on November 2. Mayor Phillips replied no, because by law only the city council has the authority to authorize or revise sales taxes.

Louie Davis, 321 Garden Hill Road, said he is opposed to the city council being able to increase taxes without input from the citizens. He said this is a bad economic time to place more taxes on the citizens.

Misti Boackle, 1725 Moncrief Road, said she is concerned about the families like hers who count every penny to make ends meet. She said everyone she has talked to about the tax increase is against it, and the council will be going against the will of the people if it is approved.

Patricia Hosch, 185 Patrick Lane, said she agrees with the comments made by Ms. Boackle and agrees that the council should carry out the wishes of the citizens.

Alan Hall, 432 Westview Road, expressed appreciation for the City employees and concern for their job security. He expressed concerns that the proposed tax increase will not improve their income or job security, since the additional taxes are earmarked for other expenditures.

Derek Johnson, 4185 Sierra Way, also stated that he was concerned about the City employees, and funds should be allocated for employee raises.

David Ricker, 1144 Kimberly Avenue, said the City of Gardendale doesn't have a property tax and questioned how aggressively the City is pursuing economic development opportunities. He said the City needs to be aggressively pursuing new businesses if we are going to continue to rely on sales taxes.

Russell Smith of Watts Engineering Sales, 2230 North Road, said he opposed the tax increase because sales taxes are regressive and hurt the people who are least able to pay them. He added that the City should come up with more creative ways than a sales tax increase to address the City's budget shortfall.

Dee Gray, accountant for the City of Gardendale, spoke in favor of the ordinance and expressed concerns that the City's financial reserves are decreasing and will not last much longer if the citizens aren't willing to pay additional taxes for the services they receive from the City.

Councilor Phillips objected to Ms. Gray's remarks, saying the easiest way for politicians to raise money is to raise taxes; the City has been in much worse financial condition in the past; and the City should be pursuing economic development opportunities instead of raising taxes.

Jerome Cantrell, 1691 Quail Ridge Drive, said instead of raising taxes the City should cultivate additional economic development and should reduce employees' salaries as well as reduce the number of employees.

In reply to Mr. Cantrell's remarks, Mayor Phillips said the city council has reduced the operating budget by \$900,000 in each of the past two years; the city council's goal has been to reduce operating expenses without laying off employees due to the adverse impact on their families and their spending power; and the City has been recruiting new businesses but hasn't had much success due to the economic environment.

Dean Taylor said he has a business in Gardendale and lives in Gardendale, and he thanked the mayor and council members for their service to the City of Gardendale.

Councilor Phillips spoke again and said the city council is not considering laying off any employees and, in fact, is trying to come up with a way to give the employees a raise. Compared to other organizations, especially some businesses in the private sector, he said the City is doing well financially and is nowhere close to being in such poor financial condition to require a sales tax increase.

Mayor Phillips asked if there was any more discussion; there was no reply. He then called for a vote on the motion, as amended. The motion carried by a 4-2 vote of the council members, with Councilors Tumlin, Morris, Currington, and Harper voting aye and Mayor Phillips and Councilor Phillips voting no.

**PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 2010-14: TO IMPOSE A MORATORIUM ON THE LICENSING OF MONEY BROKERS IN THE CITY OF GARDENDALE, INCLUDING THE SURROUNDING POLICE JURISDICTION.** Councilor Tumlin introduced Ordinance 2010-14 and made a motion for its adoption. Mayor Phillips then called the roll of the council members for the purpose of obtaining unanimous consent to consider the proposed ordinance and recorded the following votes:

Councilor Phillips then made another motion for adoption of the ordinance. The motion was seconded by Councilor Currington. There was no discussion. The ordinance was adopted by unanimous consent of the council members.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2010-38: TO TERMINATE A RESTRICTIVE COVENANT ON THE USE OF THE REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 542 MAIN STREET.** Councilor Tumlin introduced and made a motion for adoption of Resolution No. 2010-38. The motion was seconded by Councilor Morris. There was no discussion. The motion then carried by unanimous consent of the council members.

#### CITIZENS' COMMUNICATIONS

Ms. Shirley Godwin, 5021 Cypress Street, asked about the status of the proposed park in the Newcastle community. Mayor Phillips said the City has received a Community Development Block Grant from Jefferson County to build the park. He said Dr. Hamilton in the Jefferson County Community Development department has told him the park will be completed in 2011.

Mr. Jeff Dennis, owner of Jeff Dennis Jewelers, said he will work for the good of the City of Gardendale even though the vote on the sales tax didn't go as he and many other people hoped it would.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the council, Councilor Harper made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Councilor Phillips and carried by unanimous consent of the councilors. Meeting adjourned.
